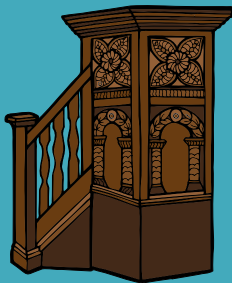


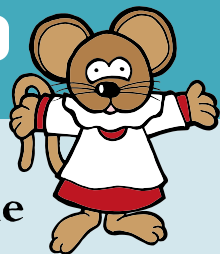
5 The Pulpit

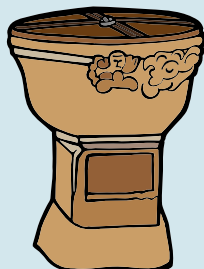
6 The South Aisle

It is known as the

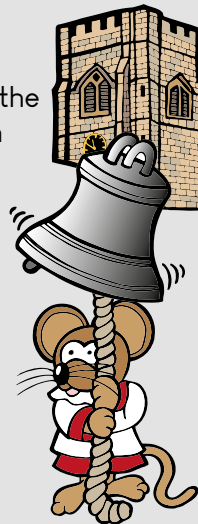
The font is the oldest item in the church and dates from the early 13th century.

How many bells are in the bell chamber?

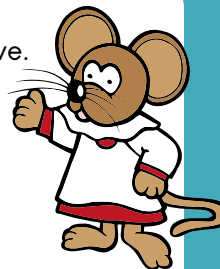

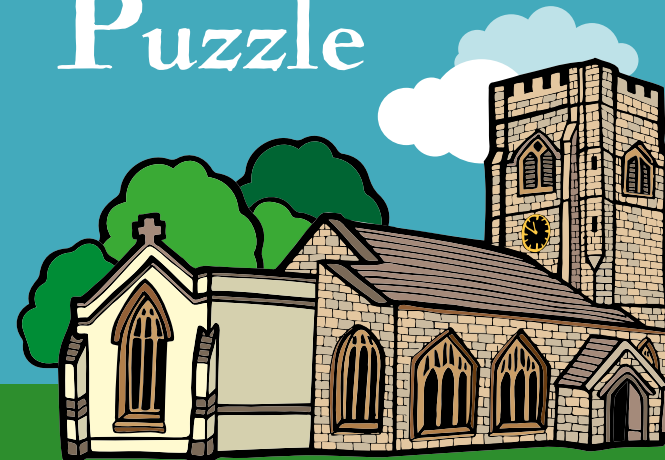

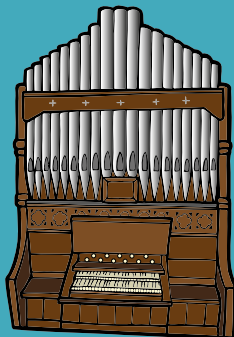

3 The Organ

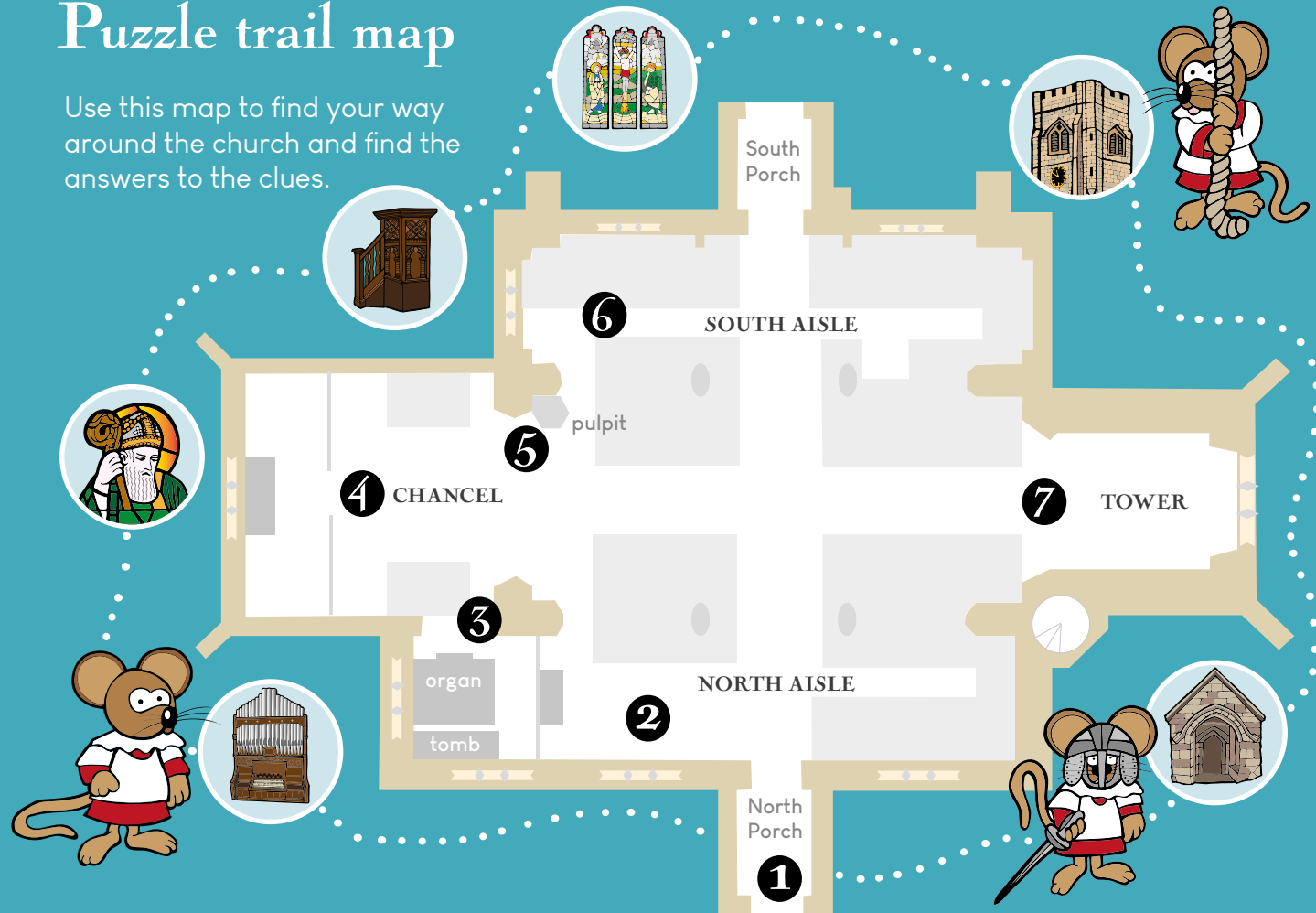
The organ came from Henry Jones & Sons, Fulham Road, London. It was dedicated on 25th April 1899.
